Current and Planned Initiatives

- 1) Windows and doors have been ordered with a view to install as soon as they are ready.
- 2) The next phase would be the construction of the kitchen, a dining area and toilets.
- 3) Furnishing and equipping of the classrooms and office.
- 4) Fencing.
- 5) Electrical wiring/installing solar panels.

In the beginning, our goal was to improve primary School education by providing text books. After several years, we found that the results have not improved. So our focus has now shifted to creating Early Childhood Education Centres which will provide three (3) years of foundation learning that will not only prepare young children for primary school curriculum, but also instill in them positive attitudes towards learning. This is our first pilot project. The structure consists of 4 rooms of which 3 will be classrooms and one the Head Teacher's office.


The construction of the Early Childhood Education Center above is in Kidera village, Rubongi Subcounty. It is collaboration between the community and JWII. The community of Kidera donated land, built the foundation and walls of the 4-room school block. JWII provided funds for roofing materials and labour.

The Early Childhood Education Center in Kidera village expects to open in January 2021. The expected intake is 120 pupils, comprising 3, 4, and 5-year old children. The date will be determined based on when most primary schools open in Uganda.

JWII's long-term vision is to have numerous Early Childhood Education centers dotted all over Padhola.
